Assignments included Engineering Watch Supervisor on two Ballistic Missile submarines and while on the commissioning crew for a new construction Fast Attack boat, Lead Nuclear Planner on a destroyer Tender, Reactor Plant Technology Instructor, and Nuclear Prototype Instructor.

Michael Wills, KA4CSM, Command Sergeant Major (CSM) ret. US Army 1969-1993, Vietnam 70-71, started career as a turbine engine repairman and served the next 20 years in the Field Artillery mostly on 105mm and 8" howitzers. Retired as a Brigade CSM.




















I have been researching batteries that can be charged with solar panels to power my ham gear. The battery would be used in the event of a power outage or maybe even for "Parks on the Air." I looked at many different batteries and decided on the Bioenno line. As you may imagine there are many to chose from. I chose the LiFePO4 12 volt 20 Amp. Lithium Iron Phosphate battery. They are good for over 2000 charge cycles, lightweight, capable of charging by solar or DC, pure sine, and emit no EMI or RFI, and with the power box can charge cell phones, ipads, almost anything with an USB cable.

I purchased a package which included the battery, its charger, 120 watt solar panels, cables, 30 amp controller and power box, taxes and shipping for \$600.00.

One of the things that made my decision easier were the charts that indicate the batteries performance in different situations. Go to <u>Bioennopower.com</u> and scroll down to "Ham and Communications" several charts will appear. Select the chart corresponding to the type of transmitter you have. Also weighing heavily was the fact that they were in stock and ready to be shipped and they have excellent customer service.
