

# What's Fun About Saying "59 05" A Thousand Times? By Kevan Nason, N4XL

I often hear that question and once asked it myself. "59 05" is the exchange phrase used for us here in South Carolina during the CQ World Wide contest. During a typical 48 hour contest I typically say that a thousand times or more. Well, either I do or the Digital Voice Keyer in my computer does. My answer to the question may surprise you. Be it "59 Oh Five", "59 South Carolina", or "59 Oh Eight", there isn't anything fun about saying it over and over and over. So why am I passionate about HF contesting? The answers are both simple and complex.

I love to learn new things. It wasn't until I started wondering what those other guys that whupped me were doing that I began to understand what it takes to reliably send a strong signal around the world – and that you really can do it with only 100 watts. I enjoy hearing and watching the magic of propagation come alive in my ears while watching a gray line map move across an image of the world while also seeing spots from those faraway places come and go with the sun. It's satisfying to think 15 meters should be opening to Japan, spin the beam from Europe to the northwest, and sure enough, they are just beginning to pop up and gradually become stronger. It's made me a better operator for both normal and emergency communications. After thousands of QSO's in conditions ranging from "whisper quiet" to virtually unintelligible because of QRM that I no longer need a signal to be S9 +20 dB, and completely in the clear, to get a message through. I'm no longer intimidated by my radio because I understand how to use its buttons and knobs. And I love contesting because successes have proven (to myself) that the quest to better myself has been worthwhile. They have also given me the respect of my peers and I am humbled that others are interested in what I can share about what I've learned.

Those and dozens or other reasons are what Contesting is truly about.






#### Labeling Shack Wires By Kevan Nason, N4XL

I don't remember were, but I had read a post from a ham talking about using colored zip ties with a flat tab on the end to label the myriad of cables in his shack. Sounded like a good idea so I bought some. They work very well. You can either directly use a Sharpie marker or write on the provided peel and stick labels. I've recently switched radio positions in my SO2R shack and then removed and replaced one rig when I took it to our STEAM tables in October. The work was much easier and quicker to do with the wires clearly labeled – and there wasn't a single misconnected wire. Forget what the cost was, but not much. If you wanted more writing area you could even use both sides of the tab. Using a matching color scheme helps too, but despite good intentions I didn't have sufficient attention to detail to manage that nicety. A couple labels fell off because I didn't first clean the plastic with alcohol, but that isn't the zip tie's fault. That's why there are two ways of marking shown. Available on Amazon. (The cables marked "KEY" and "ACC" in the image were provided by microHAM for identifying their cables.)

# From The ARES Letter for November 16, 2022, submitted by Kevan, N4XL

The FEMA Emergency Management Institute (EMI) has released a new online study course and exam on Preparing the Nation for Space Weather Events. The course identifier is IS-66. ARRL Director of Emergency Management (DEM) Josh Johnston, KE5MHV, took the course and passed the exam. Johnston said: "This course provides some interesting insight to the Federal Government's role and response to space weather events." It also "explains the levels of response the government uses in regard to space weather events." Johnston concluded: "This course would be a good training course for any ham to gain a better understanding of how space weather affects communications here on Earth." "This is a useful course and only takes about 2 hours to take online," Johnston said. A FE-MA student ID is required and is free from the Emergency Management Institute online.
