

## From The ARES Letter for November 16, 2022, provided by Kevan N4XL

The FEMA Emergency Management Institute (EMI) has released a new online study course and exam on Preparing the Nation for Space Weather Events. The course identifier is IS-66. ARRL Director of Emergency Management (DEM) Josh Johnston, KE5MHV, took the course and passed the exam. Johnston said: "This course provides some interesting insight to the Federal Government's role and response to space weather events." It also "explains the levels of response the government uses in regard to space weather events." Johnston concluded: "This course would be a good training course for any ham to gain a better understanding of how space weather affects communications here on Earth." "This is a useful course and only takes about 2 hours to take online," Johnston said. A FEMA student ID is required and is free from the Emergency Management Institute online.

#### Confirming QSO's with mobile stations. From Kevan Nason, N4XL

Some of you may want to confirm q's with mobiles you work during contests. A good reason to do that would be if you are hunting counties. Not being much of an award hunter I wasn't aware LOTW isn't very mobile friendly. The following post from AA4TI was on the **QSO** Party website and might help folks get a better mobile confirmation percentage.

When you are a fixed station, it is easy to confirm via LOTW. When you are working a SQP as a mobile, it is a much bigger issue since you have to set up LOTW for each county that you work. It also means scrubbing your log to separate out each county before submitting the log to LOTW. Additionally, LOTW can't be used for the USACA award... you must have QSL's or Mobile Reply Cards.

Most mobile Ops do not make the effort to submit to LOTW since those confirmations don't count for much other than Worked All States award from ARRL. That's why you have confirmations from Laci (a fixed station) and not Rich (generally mobile). If you want to confirm those 137 contacts with Rich when he was mobile, send him MRC's and an SASE.

If you want confirmations from any mobile station, it is best to send an MRC and SASE directly to the mobile. My experience has been that nearly 100% of the mobiles will sign and return the cards. Also, do not send a QSL card since that requires the mobile to fill out his QSL and modify it for the counties he operated in.

#### ARRL Roanoke Division, Jim Boehner, N2ZZ

A Christmas message of hope. ARRL has worked with Congress to introduce legislation which would bring relief to those operators living in communities, neighborhoods and subdivisions with antenna restrictions.



For the past three years, ARRL's Legislative Advocacy Committee has met with congressional leaders and staff to develop a bill containing language which can realistically pass and become law. U.S. Rep. Bill Johnson (R-Ohio 6th District) introduced H.R. 9670 -- the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act. Rep. Johnson plans to refile the bill in the upcoming 118th Congress when that session convenes in January.

Other sponsors are being lined up to support the bill and ARRL will be developing pro-

Other sponsors are being lined up to support the bill and ARRL will be developing programs where members can contact their House representatives to support the legislation.

Antenna relief is critical to many Hams in the Roanoke Division. Vice Director Bill Morine, N2COP, and Section Managers Jack Smith, KE4LWT, of Virginia; Marv Hoffman, WA4NC, of North Carolina; Marc Tarplee, N4UFP, of South Carolina and West Virginia's Dan Ringer, K8WV, and I have all heard from members frustrated at attempts to get on the air in antenna restricted communities. This is especially true in areas with high concentrations of housing units, especially near cities in metropolitan areas. Many Hams have complained they have little choice in housing in some areas, especially if they need to be close to work. Also, an increasing trend are Hams who are downsizing into retirement and senior communities with antenna restrictions. According to building trade associations, an estimated 70%-90% of new housing has private deed covenants, many of which contain antenna restrictions.

Another benefit which H.R. 9670 — the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act will bring is encouragement to those who live in communities with antenna restrictions to become licensed for the first time. The title of bill H.R. 9670 — the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act emphasizes that Amateur Radio operator volunteers offer emergency communications in natural and manmade disasters at no cost to the public.

In addition to H.R. 9670 -- the Amateur Radio Emergency Preparedness Act, introduced this week in Congress was H.R. 9664, the ARRL Symbol Rate Bill. Its purpose is to force the FCC to act on the 2016 proposal to replace the archaic maximum 300 baud symbol rate for digital communications and require a bandwidth maximum of 2.8 kilohertz. The United States is the only remaining developed nation with this obsolete constraint which hampers high speed data exchange and experimentation in digital modes.

More information will be forthcoming on this and on other developments in the Roanoke Division in the upcoming end year division newsletter which will be released this coming week. Until then, Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to all ARRL members and Hams and their families in the four states of the Roanoke Division.


