GARS has been invited to participate in the iMAGINE Lakelands STEAM Festival scheduled for Saturday, October 21, from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. in uptown Greenwood.

The iMAGINE Lakelands STEAM Festival is designed to showcase PreK-12 education and career pathways in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) through fun, hands-on learning for families from across Abbeville, Edgefield, Greenwood, Laurens, McCormick, Newberry, and Saluda Counties.

This is a highly visible street festival that engages companies, schools, and nonprofits in providing exciting, interactive STEAM learning exhibits for PreK - 12students and their families. The purpose of the festival is to ignite the interest of students in STEAM learning and career pathways.

iMAGINE is a program of South Carolina's Coalition for Mathematics and Science (SCCMS) at Clemson University.

Last year over 100 people visited our booth and learned about GARS, Ham radio, and Morse Code.

Our GARS booth introduces kids (and adults) to Morse Code. From Nov/Dec 2003 NCJ. Gary W9XT says "Be Loud". Being loud is relative. You are loud at S5 on a quiet band, but weak at S9 if QRM is S9+20 dB. Know which bands and at what times you are loudest.

He also said "From time to time there will be a thread on the Internet contest forums about how contests are unfair or fixed. Usually this is started by a contester who has been contesting for a couple of years and has been unable to crack the top ten list. While the playing field is certainly not level, the reality is that some contesters spend decades developing their skills and stations. They spend countless hours between contests preparing for the next one. It would be unrealistic to make the PGA tour a year or two after picking up your first golf club. You are not going to become a world-class contester just by operating a couple of Sweepstakes."

Excerpts from the Jan/Feb 2003 issue of the National Contest Journal Contest Tips, Tricks & Techniques section by Gary Sutcliffe, W9XT

AA4NU suggests reading the NCJ. Whenever he meets a beginning contester he loans him a stack of NCJs from the last few years and tells them to read them all.

K5AF told SO2R ops "S&P low and run high." This means you should be CQing on the higher of the two bands and search and pouncing on the lower one. The reason for this is that harmonics of the CQing transmitter will not fall into the band you are listening to. This is especially useful to those without elaborate filtering systems.

K9GS said when CQing, "Always strive to correctly copy the full call sign of the calling station the first time. This helps establish a rhythm which increases not only your rate but the total score."

W6EU's tips were: • Change your goal from "making 1000 QSOs" to "staying in the chair the full allowed time." • Set up a TV set in the shack. Turn the sound down and watch a football game while you operate. (Editors note: Time for SO2R/SO2V instead?) • Test out your station and software several days before the contest.


W9XT tips were: • Use spreadsheets to plan contest strategies. Play what if scenarios to determine optimal mix of CW and SSB QSO's (for mixed mode contests). • If trying a different category entry, i.e.: QRP, get on the air several times before the contest using that band/mode and learn some of its idiosyncrasy's and tricks.

Congratulations to Kevan N4XL for being at the top of the Swamp Fox Contest Group Leaderboard on September 18, 2023. He is #1 in overall standings with 7915 total QSO's and 5814 CW QSO's.

Our second Simplex net was held immediately after our 2 meter net on September 28. Dave, KY4GM was the net controller and N4XL. KA4CSM, K4XB, KA4PQA, WT3M & W3RXF all checked in. I (KA4CSM) could only hear KY4GM, perhaps as I was out on the lake further than others. I could only hear KY4GM as he checked others in. KY4GM is using a Tram 1481 35 feet up from the bottom fed with lmr 400, confirming the importance of a good antenna.

Several observations for those not familiar with simplex operations:

The National 2m simplex calling frequency is 146.520, Greenwood county is 147.570. UHF simplex is 446.000. Our net is held on 147.570 Protocol states the National Calling frequency is used to start communications then QSY to another frequency No offset & no tone are used No repeater is involved—simply station to station (Line of site) Depending on your QTH you may not hear others checking in or talking on the net.
