



Ask the Elmers (an advice column for Hams)

Dear Elmers,

I heard there is a solar eclipse happening sometime this year (2024). When will it happen, and will we be able to see it in South Carolina? Also, does a solar eclipse cause problems with ham radio transmissions?

-- Just wondering

Dear Just Wondering,

Thank you for your question.

Seeing a solar eclipse, especially a total solar eclipse, is a truly awesome experience, and a rare occurrence in most people's lives. Hopefully, you experienced the total solar eclipse that occurred over South Carolina on August 21, 2017.

This year, on April 8th, another solar eclipse will occur across part of Mexico and North America. Most Americans will be able to see it in some form, but the distance between your location and the path of totality will determine how much of the sun will be covered by the moon. The path of totality, the complete covering of the sun by the moon, of this eclipse is too far to the north and west of South Carolina for us to see a total eclipse. However, we will see a partial eclipse for 2 hours 33 minutes, with 79.1% of the sun obscured by the moon at the peak of the eclipse. Depending on local weather, the partial eclipse which will be visible throughout all 48 contiguous U.S. states. The eclipse will begin at 2:06 p.m., with totality between 3:19 p.m. and 3:23 p.m., and will end at 4:33 p.m.

As to whether a solar eclipse affects ham radio signals, the answer is yes, When the moon blocks the sun during a solar eclipse, there is a noticeable change in the Ionosphere, or upper atmosphere of the Earth. This change in the Ionosphere affects radio communications, including ham radio.

SOLAR ECLIPSE WILL OCCUR SOON

A total solar eclipse that will be seen across North America will occur on Monday, April 8th. It will be the last of its kind in the US for the next 20 years.

Hams across North America are asked to participate in a study about how the ionosphere functions by getting on the air to help scientists in a series of ionospheric experiments.

Ham Radio Science Citizen Investigation (HamSCI) has presentations for hams interested in participating on Wednesday, March 27 at 8;00 PM (Eastern) - 5:00 PM (Pacific)*, and that same day at 10:00 PM (Eastern) - 7:00 PM (Pacific)*. Both 30-minute presentations will held on Zoom and they will feature HamSCI's Festivals of Eclipse Ionospheric Science (FoEIS). The presenters will take your questions during the presentations.

Here is the link to the presentations.

The program will start by covering HamSCI's basis and purpose, and quickly move into why they are conducting experiments, how hams and shortwave listeners (SWLS) can participate, and what they hope to learn from the event. Along the way, they will discuss why the science behind the event is important to users of the high-frequency radio spectrum - including amateur radio operators!




