Assignments included Engineering & Watch Supervisor on two Ballistic Missile submarines, member of commissioning crew for a new construction Fast At tack boat, Lead Nuclear Planner on a destroyer Tender, Reactor Plant Technology Instructor, and Nuclear Prototype Instructor.

Michael Wills, KA4CSM, Command Sergeant Major (CSM) ret. US Army, 1969-1993, Vietnam 70-71, started career as a turbine engine repairman and served the next 20 years in the Field Artillery mostly on 105mm and 8" howitzers. Retired as a Brigade CSM.



Allen West, KB4RA, United States Navy 1962-1966, ATN2. This picture was taken in 1964 or 65 over the North Atlantic at about 5000 feet which was our working altitude. Bumpy rides most of the time at that altitude. Served as an airborne radio operator and technician in VW-11 for two years. Based in Argentina, New foundland, and Keflavik, Iceland. Crewmember on EC-121-K Lockheed Super Constellations in the North Atlantic as an air borne extension of the Dew Line radar

During my tenure I had the pleasure of watching an island being born off the coast of Iceland, now called Surtsey, (See Wikipedia.) Something new hams need to be aware of is a less-than obvious bit of old-timey ham-speak still in use. You may hear a ham say, "hi or "hihi" over the air or in person or in writing, and, curiously, their particular use of the term, "hi" is not in context of a greeting. In hamspeak the term "hi" means laughter. Often doubled (hihi), it's a ham's way of expressing a humorous response. So when a ham says, "hi" (s) he is laughing at some thing. Kind of like saying LOL in a text message or web post.

Where did this come from? In the early days of amateur radio, CW was the only mode so all communications were in Morse code. The word HI in Morse is dit-dit-dit dit-dit, (•••• ••) which sounds like an electronic chuckle. Quickly adopted, hams have been using "hi" for laughter decades after voice and other modes were added to our radio amateur repertoire.

We'll wrap up with a ham joke: Two antennas met on a roof, fell in love and got married. The ceremony wasn't much, but the reception was excellent. Hihi
